Game and Fish Update

• Hunter Safety Class will be held in Cokeville on April 26 - May 1, 2010. Classes will run daily from Monday through Friday at 4:00 P.M. and culminate on Saturday with a final exam and live firing from 9:00 to 12:00. Class is open to adults and youth. For registration or information contact instructor Roger Warner.

• The Cokeville Meadows National Wildlife Refuge continues to move forward in the process to develop a management plan. At meetings scheduled on April 20th and 21st planning team members from the USFWS, WGFD, City of Cokeville, and

Lincoln County will begin to analyze and incorporate resource studies and public comments into a plan framework. The planning process is expected to be completed in late winter 2011-2012.

• The WGFD has completed big game winter censuses. Elk numbers remain high and liberal elk hunting seasons have been proposed for 2010, especially for antlerless elk hunting under reduced-price cow/calf tags. Although mule deer fawn crops were relatively low for the second year, low winter mortality due to light winter conditions will help to compensate for low reproduction. A 14 day deer season has been proposed again for 2010 in

the Cokeville/Kemmerer area.

• WGFD managers remain concerned about moose populations. Sampling of harvested animals demonstrates a continued presence of *Elaeophora*, also known as blood worm. Hunting proposals for moose remain conservative with no antlerless permits issued in hunt area 26 near Cokeville.

• All public meetings to review hunting seasons have been completed in Region 4. Hunting season proposals await approval of Wyoming Game and Fish Commission.

• The antler hunting regulation that is in effect from January 1st through April

30th has been highly successful in reducing harassment and disturbance of big game animals on local winter ranges. Although G&F enforcement task forces have responded to a few violations, compliance overall has been quite high. Wintering big game animals have been documented on winter and transitional ranges where in the past, human activity has displaced these animals. Department managers are grateful to those sportsmen who have complied and supported the effort to protect wildlife.

Recycling at the Cokeville Landfill

The landfill is open Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday from 8-4.

Recycling bins are inside. They are for sorted office pack, newspaper, magazines, aluminum cans, tin cans, clear glass and brown glass. Also accepted are household disposal of: e-waste (computers, peripherals & Tv's), used motor oil, used cooking oil (separated from the motor oil!) and lead acid (vehicle) batteries.

We do not recycle plastics because they require a large quantity to make a single bale and we do not have any place to store the plastic. Cardboard is a problem at Cokeville because we do not have a place to store it. If you have a large quantity of cardboard please contact the landfill or call Mary Crosby at 877-2095 and we will see what we can work out.

Three Cokeville women, Jill Dayton, Dottie Jo Pope and Janel Dayton, went to Nauvoo, Illinois to attend a two-day Women's Retreat with about 120 other women. Jill was one of six presenters. Her talk was entitled, "Fear Not: Have Hope in Your Savior." Dotty Jo assisted in the presentation by giving some of her life experiences that have contributed to her strong faith in Jesus Christ. She also told her experience in developing the

program centered on the Parable of the Ten Virgins. Her group has presented the two-hour program in about fifty stakes. Dotty Jo has been invited to take the presentation to Nauvoo next year for the Women's Retreat. Jill also took the part of Emma Smith, wife of the prophet Joseph Smith, in three reenactments of the organization of the Relief Society. The reenactments took place in the upstairs of the Red Brick Store where the Relief Society was organized. Jill took part in the Legacy Concert, the final activity of

the retreat.

The three Cokeville ladies were snowed in at the Denver airport overnight. Luckily they were able to catch a flight to Kansas City early the next morning and then drove four hours to Nauvoo in time to attend the retreat.

They were able to go to Carthage Jail, see the Lucy Mack Smith home, and watch bricks be made. They also went to the Family Living Center where homemade bread is baked in a brick oven, rag rugs are woven, pottery is thrown, rope is

made, candles are dipped, wool is made into yarn and other home arts demonstrated. They also attended a session in the beautiful Nauvoo Temple.

April 7, 2010 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Petersen called the meeting to order at 7:13 p.m. and quorum was established.

Carol Reed moved and Larry LaFave seconded to adopt the proposed agenda with the following additions: New Business, Items 4-6 – Cultural Trust Fund Grants; Chamber Dues and Cokeville Register update – motion approved.

Karla Toomer made the motion, seconded by Carol Reed to approve March 3, 2010 Meeting Minutes – motion carried.

Treasurer Dayton presented the Treasurer's Report. The general operating account has an end-of-the-month balance of \$10,354.85 with \$605.31 in outstanding checks; the Savings account balance is \$15,822.07 and the Centennial Account balance stands at \$1,638.91. Larry LaFave moved, seconded by Carol Reed to accept the Treasurer's Report – motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Harry Staven presented an update of the Ongoing Projects

Harry Staven discussed the permitting process for the Centennial banner. The target date to erect the banner is April 15th. Karla Toomer moved, seconded by Shelly Gailey to contract with McKay Teichert for a two (2) hour rental of his bucket truck at \$80.00 per hour – motion carries.

Charlotte Freeman updated the Centennial Celebration Events. She will coordinate

the May 10th evening programming which follows the Centennial Tree planting/burial of the time capsule ceremony earlier that afternoon. Carol Reed moved, seconded by Larry LaFave to authorize a \$1,000.00 budget for Charlotte Freeman to coordinate the July 4th Business Fair as a Centennial Celebration event – motion passed unanimously.

Carol Reed reported that Brandy Quinn quoted a \$6.00 cost for the Centennial t-shirts. The membership deemed the cost to be appropriate and instructed Charles Dayton to work with the printing company on the graphics.

No action was taken on the "Welcome Party/Ambassadors" agenda item.

Chairman Petersen gave the Welcome Center Project Report. Membership concurred with Chairman Petersen that the Red Dog property is not suitable for a Chamber of Commerce office location.

NEW BUSINESS:

Charles Dayton discussed the potential hire of a Parks, Leisure-Activity, Cultural Events Intern for the summer season. It will be a 400 hour internship that will be jointly funded by the Arts Council, the Cokeville Community and the Centennial Fund at \$500.00 each. The intern will develop a recreation assessment for Cokeville and develop recreation programming for all ages.

Harry Staven outlined the critical tasks associated with the Teichert Art Exhibit Grant. Charles Dayton and Harry Steven will jointly coordinate the grant.

The Sign Grant action item was tabled to May, 2010

meeting.

The Cultural Trust Fund Grant action item was tabled to May, 2010 meeting.

No action was taken on the Chamber of Commerce Dues action item.

Harry Staven reported that Shelly Gailey will need to purchase a license for the MS-Publisher software immediately. Chairman Petersen informed that the membership had already approved the purchase at an earlier meeting. The editor will proceed to purchase the software.

Larry LaFave moved, seconded by Carol Reed, to authorize the Treasurer to make a monthly payment to Shelly Gailey for her services as the editor of the newspaper, in the amount of \$100.00, for each of the next six months; motion passed.

Chairman Petersen asked membership to authorize the payment of \$95.40 to Powder-Hound Engraving, for Person of the Year and Lifetime Achievement plaques. Authorization was granted.

Harry Staven volunteered to work on the Chamber of Commerce 2010-11 Lincoln County budget request.

Meeting Adjourned at 9:55 – Larry LaFave moved, seconded by Carol Reed – motion carried.

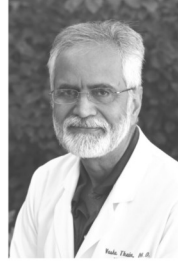
