Charles Dayton, Jonathan Teichert and Harry Staven have been working with the Lower Valley Energy from Afton to explore the feasibility of bringing natural gas service to Cokeville. The technical aspects of the plan are being developed. The current focus is on the financial feasibility and a concept plan is scheduled to be presented to the Town Council no later than May 2010.

The Cokeville Police Department has been busy. Recent traffic stops have resulted in seizures of enormous amounts of drugs, and several arrests. The most recent incident took place on Thursday, March 4, at 11:30am, during a traffic stop on US 30. Cokeville Police recovered 33 pounds of marijuana during a K9 search of the vehicle, and the suspect was booked into the LCSO Jail.

On the evening of February 23, CVPD stopped a vehicle for speeding on US 30. The driver was inconsistent in the information given to police, making officers suspicious. A K9 search of his vehicle produced 31 pounds of Marijuana packed in six

plastic buckets. Police chief, Aaron Miller, believes the drugs were being transported from Sacramento, California to Lincoln, Nebraska.

In addition to Marijuana, recent traffic stops have produced Methamphetamines,

fire arms, drug paraphernalia, and even 2 poached Eagles and 2 poached hawks.

Recipe of the Month

Each month in the Cokeville Paper there will be a featured recipe. This month's outstanding recipe comes from the kitchen of Clara Dayton. **Mrs. Dayton's Famous Chocolate Roll recipe...**

|-----------------------|----------------------------|
| 10 eggs separated | 3/4 cups granulated sugar |
| 3/4 cups sifted flour | 3 tablespoons Cocoa |
| 1/2 teaspoon salt | 1/2 teaspoon baking powder |

Beat egg whites, very stiff (should form straight peaks) Combine cocoa with 6 tablespoons of sugar; gradually add to beaten egg whites, mix well. Combine flour, salt and baking powder. Fold by hand (do not use mixer) flour mixture into beaten egg whites. Beat egg yolks until thick, add 6 tablespoons of sugar, beat until thick. Fold beaten egg yolks into egg white mixture (Again do not use mixer)

Grease 12"x17" pan, Line with parchment paper (may use wax paper but parchment paper is best) Grease paper. Bake at 375 degrees for 17 minutes. Remove from the pan immediately onto powder sugar dusted dishtowel. Roll up, when cool unroll, fill with whipped cream.

Fudge Sauce-Combine 2 cups of sugar, 4 tablespoons of cocoa. Add 1-12 ounces of canned milk, 2 tablespoons of light corn syrup. Mix well. Bring to boil. Cook over medium heat for six to nine minutes to desired thickness.

MEETING MINUTES FOR March 03, 2010

Attending the meeting were Stewart Petersen, Charles Dayton, Dan Richardson, Carol Reed, Karla Toomer, Maurey Young, Penny Larson, and Marcia Casper (of Wyoming Frontier Development). Harry Staven staff.

Following is an abbreviated version of the meeting minutes. For a full copy, contact Carol Reed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Harry suggested that funds spent for development of the Legion park may be best spent by building a restroom.

Harry has been in discussion with Bear Lake Hospital District regarding having them manage a wellness (fitness) center here in Cokeville. Harry suggested we compile a survey to find out how much money people would be willing to pay to use a fitness center in town.

The Wyoming State architect wants to postpone the Historical Preservation Architectural Review until the weather and snow allow the architect to get on the roof of the opera house.

The first edition of the Cokeville Register community newspaper is being finalized. A draft copy was distributed and briefly discussed. The consensus was that it looked great. Harry discussed five entities that have committed to advertising in the register, but have not signed contracts.

The Centennial banner wasn't hung. Hardware is still being rounded up. Hardware, location, logistics and permissions regarding the banner was discussed. Harry will work on permission from the power company. A boom truck may be

needed to hang the banner.

Charles spoke with representatives from the Eleutian Company, and they said that at this time they will not be coming to Cokeville. A general discussion followed regarding reasons why they are not coming. They are dealing with falling revenue and moving their headquarters. Charles said that Eleutian felt that the response from Cokeville residents was lukewarm. Karla noted that there were technical problems with Eleutian's online application process and that many applicants were never contacted by Eleutian.

A discussion regarding business recruitment ensued, wherein the main points were that: 1) Business recruitment is not an efficient enterprise; a 10% success rate would be considered very good. Therefore, we need to have lots of leads to pursue. 2) We have very little power to influence whether an existing business comes to Cokeville. 3) We need to continue to have a three-pronged approach, wherein we are trying to recruit existing businesses to Cokeville, further develop local existing businesses, and help build 'Cokeville Branded' businesses.

Karla noted that there is a daycare paradox in town. In many cases, families need daycare services so that a second member of the family can seek outside employment. In order for a commercial daycare service to be started in Cokeville, there needs to be enough two-breadwinner families to support the daycare. Karla noted that due to state and county laws, in-home daycare services must be minimal and therefore not very profitable. If Cokeville recruits a business to town that employs a substantial number of people, one of the

problems in getting people to sign up for the jobs (especially before the business actually comes to town) will be daycare.

Carol Reed is going to price T-shirts for the Centennial from Everlovin' Creations (Kelly Young and Brandy Quinn), and report at the next meeting. Carol will get a couple shirts with sample text on the back and Karla will handle getting sponsors. Residents and businesses may be allowed to be "sponsors" by paying \$25 - \$30. Sponsors will have space on the back of the T-shirts, which may include cattle and horse brands.

The Harlem Ambassadors basketball show (www.harlemambassadors.com) has been booked for March 18th. Tickets are available at the Store and Town Hall, as well as from Carol. Tickets are being distributed to locations in Afton, Kemmerer and Montpelier. A motion was made by Karla to accept the lowest bid for Motel rooms in which to house the Harlem Ambassadors. After some discussion regarding the Ambassadors' requirements for housing and whether the lowest bid met those requirements, the motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS:

Charles noted that the Cokeville Arts Council has received a state/federal grant for \$10,000 for art-related business development, advertising, and promotion.

Charles presented a list of Summer 2010 cultural events, several of which were discussed:

Minerva Teichert Exhibit, June - September LDS church.

Equine Event: Horse Training Clinics and Colt Starting Challenge, June 25-26.

Western Wyoming Plein Air Competition, August 10-12. Artists are invited to paint local landscapes and the paintings are judged and then sold.

Minerva Teichert Art Show, August 12-13.

Karla Suggested using some money to make brochures for the Minerva Teichert Art Show.

Dan reported that plans for the Equine Event are moving forward. Shane Haviland will teach 6-8 mini-clinics each lasting 1.0 - 1.5 hours each with about 5 participants in each mini-clinic. Participants can choose which mini-clinics to attend. We will probably not charge to watch the clinic. The colt starting challenge will be a one day event, with a possible call-back at the 24th of July Celebration.

Karla reported on a sock-hop dance that is in the planning stages for the 25th of March for high school students. It will last 20-30 minutes and will be part of the centennial celebration.

Charles is meeting with a Parks and Recreation person from Green River Friday at town hall from 11:00 - 2:00 to discuss issues and visit locations around town.

Chamber of Commerce Person of the Year 2009 and Lifetime Achievement Award was discussed. Names were nominated and voted upon. Winners to be announced later.

A motion was made and passed unanimously to offer Eva Clark up to \$300.00 for the copyright fee for her book on early homesteaders. It is felt that having this book as part of the Centennial Celebration will be one of the few tangible and continuing things to come out of the celebration.
